Weekly Update and News

1. Our first full week of Grade 1 Curriculum!

For the first time this year, we will have a full five days to cover a week of Grade 1 reading skills and finish off our review of the Kindergarten common core standards. We will now have our reading and spelling tests on Fridays. This week our tests will take place on Friday, October 3rd.

2. Test anxiety anticipation and suggestions

We survived our first testing experience with only a few tears. Please discuss with your child that if he or she gets stuck on a word to continue on with the test and that they can come back and can try that word later. Sometimes, students realize they forgot how to spell one word and shut down for the rest of the test. Reading comprehension tests are guided at the beginning of the year, meaning I read the test and the choices to them. This test will mostly be assessing comprehension of the story, *Pig in a Wig. A* friendly reminder that the text from the story is located behind this week's spelling words and this week's high-frequency words will be located on the blue papers to cut out and practice.

3. Homework

Thank you for continuing to check that your child is placing the homework back into his or her folder. I'm still having a difficult time reading first and last names on the homework. This is a skill that students should practice daily and is expected to be legible in first grade. If a child is absent, I will send home the work with a sick stamp at the top, indicating that he or she is expected to complete the missing work, but it is not expected the next day. Again, if you find that your child is finishing homework too quickly, the story of the week will be listed behind the spelling words list. He or she can practice reading for their comprehension test on Friday. Also, encourage your children to read any books they have or write sentences with their spelling words and high-frequency words.

4. Website

Last week, I was really excited to share with you the news of our new class website. I showed the students on Monday what the website looked like and how to access it. We explored the newsletter section, the area where parents can contact me, and an area where they can play games recommended by the George School Library (when they are done with their homework of course).


<u>This week:</u> We will continue last week's work on matching numbers to sets of objects, counting forward from a random number within 100, and picking the smaller or bigger number when comparing numbers. Please continue having your children use the words:

1.	is greater than
2.	is less than
3.	is equal to

We will work on counting groups of objects and identifying a number that is greater than that group of objects and a number one less than that group of objects.

- K.CC.7- compare 2 written numbers between 1 and 10.
