

Numbers and Operations in Base Ten

This means that we will continue to look at equations in different forms. For example: Which of the following equations are true and which are false?

 $7 = 8 - 1 \text{ (true)}$ $5 + 2 = 2 + 5 \text{ (true)}$ $4 + 1 = 5 + 2 \text{ (false)}$ $6 = 3 - 3 \text{ (false)}$ $12 = 21 \text{ (false)}$
