

<u>This week:</u> We will continue to work on building numbers using tens and ones.


So far, we have worked on building only numbers in the teens. For example:

The number 18 is 1 ten and 8 ones.



Now, we will work on building larger numbers up to 99. For example:

The number 81 is 8 tens and 1 one.



#### Number and Operations in Base Ten:
