

Number and Operations in Base Ten:

- 1.NBT.2 Understand place value, that the 2 digits of a 2-digit number represents an amount of tens and ones.
- 1.NBT.3 Compare two-digit numbers based on meanings of the tens and ones digits, recording the results of comparisons with the symbols \rightarrow , =, and <.
