

# Weekly Update and News

### 1. Open House

# 2. Curriculum Update

This will be a special week. Not only are we finishing up our alphabet and kindergarten high-frequency words review, but we are also beginning our first grade curriculum on Wednesday September 17<sup>th</sup>. We will continue to have homework on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Monday and Tuesday's homework will continue with our alphabet review, but Wednesday and Thursday's homework will introduce our Week 1 reading skills and high-frequency words. This will be a unique week because usually our spelling and reading comprehension tests will take place on Fridays. Since the week of September 22<sup>nd</sup> is only a three day week, our first reading and spelling tests will take place on Wednesday, September 24<sup>th</sup>.

#### 3. Homework

I was happy to see that many children, but not all, brought in their homework this week. Please check that your child is placing the homework back into his or her folder so that I can keep track of who is completing the work. Homework is a daily expectation and I do assess who completes homework on the report card.
